THE ELECTION GOING FORWARD ... The August 2nd election was a logistical success with very few operational or technical issues and for Sims Township, that was a home run for sure! Previous elections over the last 6 years saw us handling, what could be described as, multiple mini disasters from computer and printer failures to hiccups with the tabulator and final count, which saw us having multiple visits by the I T folks from the county on several occasions. For this election, no county support was required, and we were able to reconcile election results in short order. Thank You to all who volunteered and made that 17-hour day a memorable success. Now it's onward and upward to the Grand Finale in November ...!

SPRUCING UP OUR YARD ... You may have noticed, or will soon notice, that the brush on the south side of the hall has been seriously thinned out, to the extent that the only thing that remains standing are the beautiful trees. Our next-door neighbor had contracted with a company from Lincoln that used a special machine to clean out the woods between his house and the hall and we benefited from that. At the same time, our staff met with the same contractor and had the field behind the hall cleaned out as well, so the entire area has taken on a park-like appearance. The new exterior look, coupled with all the office upgrades kind of indicates that we are trying to be really good stewards of township property!

TRANSFER STATION NEWS ... We have been in contact with Consumers Energy regarding getting electrical service to the Transfer Station and have received pricing from their Engineering Department in the amount of \$24-26,000. We have also received lease pricing from Republic for a re-furbished electric compactor and are waiting on a price from a company called Speed Tech to retro-fit our gas powered compactor with an electric motor. The purpose for these upgrades is to improve our efficiency and reduce disposal cost to the greatest extent possible. We also want to eliminate hauling and handling gasoline by our employees from Kelly's store/station. Another benefit is to reduce the number of 8-yard blue boxes in the yard from 22 to 8 or 10 as that trash cannot be obviously compacted and we lose space and are paying for air. The goal is to have two electric compactors available that will be able to handle the majority of household waste

that comes through our yard. As a nice-to-know piece of information, our gaspowered compactor is believed to be the only one in Michigan in operation as the majority of trash compaction is done by electric motors and from an environmental perspective, it just makes sense. The S-W boards will discuss the matter further within the next few days. There is a desire by some to have curbside pick-up, but for that to happen, our annual disposal fees would have to be increased to at least \$175 - 200.00/year and currently, we are at \$60.00/year.

AND FINALLY ... The Pursuit of Happiness
