Road Commission Update for Spring and Summer Projects ...

Baum Rd will be paved this Spring, and gravel will be added to 10th and 14th Streets again. For Point Lookout Rd, an additional “staggered guardrail” will be installed at the end of the asphalt with a 34” walk-thru. The Road Commission has proposed a 4’ wide asphalt walking and biking strip in the center of the road, from the end of the asphalt and new guardrail to the Pointe Market guardrail.
