The Era of Social Distancing ... Sims Township Hall and the Pandemic ... To those who have stopped by the hall recently, soon discover the door is locked and we do not allow walk-ins to the counter any longer to pay water bills or taxes due to the Governor's lockdown. We realize that this is a hardship, with the worst part being, there is no longer time for chit-chat with the Staff at the window! Water bills must be placed in the drop box next to the main entry and please pay using personal check, cashier's check or money order and no cash. Taxes are officially late at this date and must be paid at or to the county. Tags for the Transfer Station are being issued, but only by appointment with myself after 6 p.m. ... if you have a tag issue, please contact me at 989-646-0200 and we will set up a time to meet in the entry to the hall. Please have ready a tax or water bill.

Rather than five staff in the office at a time, that has been reduced to one and not more than two. We are very sorry for the inconveniences this has caused, but we also have to follow the rules. As to meetings, we continue with the monthly board meeting only and it is limited to 10 total, with 5 being board members. We are continuing with the safe distancing policy of not being closer than 6 feet. We may have to resort to teleconferencing at some point if this situation does not subside soon. All other meetings are being postponed indefinitely.

For the last four weeks, all township calls have been routed to my cell phone due to our staff shortage. There is a little light at the end of the tunnel, so late last week, those calls now go to the hall. Many of the residents who called were shocked, I guess, as they are used to having our staff answer, but we were able to muddle through it and get folks the answers they needed. The biggest item was water turn-ons for those returning for the summer months.

Changes at the Transfer Station ... The Tag I.D. program is going smoother than expected and some have found out, that if they show up without the tag, there is no longer the complimentary pass-thru as there was for the first two weeks, but Ms. Bonnie will politely ask you to turn around and go get it! Bonnie is traffic control and her "shack" has been moved to the center of the driveway. There is a **STOP** sign there also, which really means **STOP** so Bonnie can check for a tag. As a reminder, there is no re-cycling offered, but cardboard must continue to be placed in the dumpster to the far right of the drive, as it will plug up the dumpsters and the compactor.

Replacing Veterans Flags at the Cemetery ... This year we will plan on placing the flags on May 18 at 6 p.m.

Final Thought ... Some may recognize the following reminder as a song on YouTube and others may recall it as a scripture from Psalm 30:5 ... "Hold on my child, Joy comes in the morning ... Weeping only lasts for a while and the darkest hour means dawn is just in sight" ... translated may mean, there WILL be a time of JOY even in the midst of this pandemic ... so Hold On, Look for it and Expect it, and this too shall pass - not the JOY, but the pandemic ... !
