Another option is to complete the census over the phone (844-330-2020), where options for language assistance are available. Or, for nostalgic types, you can respond to the census by snail mail. Answering the nine questions takes less than 10 minutes, which is well worth the time. Michiganders will live with the results of the 2020 Census for the next 10 years. Bob did the census on-line on 5/12 and discovered it is not 1) invasive, and it is 2) easy and 3) painless ...!
