2022 ROAD PROJECT ...

The only road paving project this year has been partially completed. Phase 1 of the paving of the front portion of Ann & Nancy has been completed and Phase 2 will be the paving of the rear section of that subdivision which may be completed in September.

NEW EXTERIOR DOORS FOR THE HALL ...

Calvin Company from Flint has completed the upgrade and installation of our three exterior doors. All doors have the safety "crash bars" for exiting. The front door has internal and external palm buttons for entry and exiting and has a doorbell chime that lets the Staff know when someone comes in or leaves.

OFFICE UPGRADES ...

Our Clerk, Treasurer and Water Clerk may be getting actual offices. The Staff has put together an office design which will be reviewed and possibly approved by the Board. They get a lot of phone calls everyday and it's getting more difficult to hear conversations when there are multiple calls at one time, so there is a need for more privacy. In addition, we seem to have the need for more training as technology changes and an office will allow for more privacy for the one being trained. The offices will also allow for things to be kept out of sight and more secure. Each office will have at least one window and the doors will each have a window and will be lockable. There is a desperate need to replace the carpeting that's about 35 years old, so we may be getting bids for 2 foot x 2 foot, industrial-grade carpet and upgrade the offices and conference room areas plus our "cop shop."
